Dear Friends,

It is easy to spot and exciting to see some of the larger creatures at the nature center. When a manatee pokes its head to the surface or a school of mullet jump in unison, we marvel at these creatures. Recently, we have had the microscopes out for a viewing of plankton with visiting groups, and it really sends home the importance of small creatures to our eco-system and lives. Plankton can be plant (Phytoplankton) or animal (Zooplankton). The word plankton comes for the Greek word for drifter or wanderer.

Phytoplankton use chlorophyl to capture sunlight, consume carbon dioxide and produce oxygen as a by-product of photosynthesis. These tiny creatures help drive the global carbon cycle. Zooplankton can be comprised of microscopic snails, worms, copepods, krill and larval forms of invertebrates and fish. These largely invisible planktonic plants and animals form the base of the food chain and are a critical source of food to large and small organisms.

The same week as the microscopes were out, I read an article on the importance of the cell. It talked about how the cell membrane was full of chemical structures and the surface was ever-changing. A single living cell has large numbers of chemical processes occurring each second and there is cross-communication between cells. One item talked about, was how electric eels have special cells that generate on-demand electric current by controlling mineral ions.

There is much to be learned from the microscopic world whether it be from plankton or the workings of a single cell. Consider the small things that support the larger parts of our world.

Return of the Golden Orb Weaver by Don Knies

In the Spring, the Golden Orb Weaver (aka Banana Spider) returns to build new webs in West Lake Park. I last saw them in June of 2021, where they were featured in that month's Newsletter. These specimens will be here through at least early summer. It is believed that the species got its nickname because it often arrives in banana shipments from Central and South America. This spider is known for its super-sturdy webs and its striking color combinations. The best location to view these spiders and their webs is from the pedestrian footbridge, along the park's 14th Avenue entry walkway, south of Sheridan Street. The best viewing time is just after 8 am, looking toward the east across the watery inlet, with the sun backlighting up to 7 or 8 large spider webs.


